Since its inception in the fall of 2010, New Art / New Music has offered music students an opportunity to compose and perform an original work that connects with new art on Rice's campus.

As an interdisciplinary program, New Art / New Music offers Shepherd students real-world experience in organization, production, leadership, and advocacy. Over the last decade, this opportunity has provided exceptional composers and musicians an avenue to create and play music of their time in an inspiring and unique setting. The Moody is honored to share this tradition with the public and the campus community.

This year, led by student coordinator Jaylin Vinson (Composition major, '25), Shepherd School students organized a program of original work in response to various visual artworks and the current Moody exhibition, *Urban Impressions: Experiencing the Global, Contemporary Metropolis* on view at the Moody until December 17, 2022.
